### **Digging Deeper**

Use this guide for further personal and group study this week.

- 1. **Read Chapter 1 of 2 Thessalonians.** Paul wanted the Thessalonians to know that the relief from the severe suffering they were experiencing would only come when Jesus returns, not before. So, when we suffer, we shouldn't judge God's love, power and goodness by anything other than what Jesus did for us on the cross.
  - What does Paul say about suffering in 2 Thessalonians 1?
  - What role has suffering played in your life?



- Share some of your experience with and various times of suffering with your group. (Talking about it can be a help to others and healing to you!)
- When you face trials and suffering, are you able to view them as a tool to build character (**see James 1:2-4**)?

2. **Read Chapter 2 of 2 Thessalonians.** The Thessalonians were guilty of rampant speculation when it came to Christ's return. We need to remember that the Bible wasn't given to answer all our questions about end times, but to help us become more like Jesus.

**Read 2 Timothy 3:16-17** to see the role the Bible is supposed to play in our lives. Circle, highlight, underline, note what you see...

<sup>16</sup> All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, <sup>17</sup> so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.
**2 TIMOTHY 3:16-17** (NIV)

- What are one or two things you could do to allow God to use the Bible in the way it was designed to be used in your life?
- 3. **Read Chapter 3 of 2 Thessalonians.** Some of the Thessalonians had decided to stop working. They didn't understand the purpose of work. Maybe they thought since Jesus was returning they wouldn't have to any longer? One major purpose of work is to allow us to have something to share with others. Christians should be the hardest workers by going the extra mile and serving others.
  - How's your work ethic? Are you going the extra mile both to have something to share and to make God look good?
  - How can you avoid getting lazy? At work? At your faith?
  - Is there a key to "not growing weary in doing good"? How can you encourage one another in this? (**Hebrews 10:25**)

### Close

As you close, take time to pray for each other. Pray for each other's mindset this week and think of ways you can encourage each other. Consider **dividing into separate groups of men and women** as you pray for one another.
