## ask good **QUESTIONS**

# Good Question...

Jesus was the master of asking questions **to connect with people!** Here's a few ideas that might help you ask good questions of people, and open the door for a Gospel Conversation with them.

#### **Questions to Start...**

- Where did you grow up?
- · What was your family like?
- What did you like about school? Where did you go to college?
- How did you meet your spouse?
- How'd you end up in your career path?
- What are your dreams?
- What are you passionate about?
- What do you hope to get out of life?
- What would you change about your life if you could?

#### **Some Deeper Questions**

(You might not want to start with these...)

- What are some struggles you're facing? What fears do you have? What stressors?
- Do you think much about spiritual things?
- We've never had a chance to talk about your religious background. Where would you say you are in your spiritual journey?
- Did/Have/Do you ever go to church? What was it like?
- What is your concept of God? Do you believe he exists? Do you view him positively or negatively?

**We are sent \,** to love people and invite them to follow Jesus with

- What do you think about as you fall asleep at night?
- Do you ever wonder if there's more to life than this?

**One tip:** When you ask, do it with a heart to genuinely know and learn from/about someone. Don't ask with the agenda or mindset that "you already know", i.e. asking questions that only make them feel dumb and you look smart/knowledgable.



What is this? - Each week people from Wawasee Bible meet in small groups in various homes to learn about Jesus, pray, eat, laugh, & ive life together. We call them Life Groups. The questions here are based on the sermon each week (often a related part of Scripture), and guide each group's study. #### **Getting to Know You**

Part of our goal at Life Group is just learning more about each other. Toward that end, here's two totally random questions to discuss and break the ice as you get going. Have everyone answer at least one:

1. What's your favorite breakfast? 2. Whose life do you find inspiring?

**Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching,** was there anything you heard for the first time, that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?

#### **Digging Deeper**

Use this guide for further personal and group study this week.

- 1. The story of your own spiritual journey is one of the most powerful tools you have to tell others about Jesus. If someone were to ask you, "What has God done for you?" or "What difference has being a follower of Jesus made in your life?" what might you say regarding:
  - ... how you relate to and view others?
  - ... how you view what's most important?
  - ... how you view yourself?
- 2. When it comes to sharing our faith with others, how we live is just as important as the words we share. 1 Thessalonians 2:1-13 gives us a great picture of what sharing both our words and our life with others looks like. As you read through this passage...
  - **Circle** or **highlight** any words or phrases that catch your attention.
  - **Underline** what you think is important to remember.
  - **Put an X** next to anything that confuses you.

<sup>1</sup> You know, brothers and sisters, that our visit to you was not without results. <sup>2</sup> We had previously suffered and been treated outrageously in Philippi, as you know, but with the help of our God we dared to tell you his gospel in the face of strong opposition. <sup>3</sup> For the appeal we make does not spring from error or impure motives, nor are we trying to trick you. 4 On the contrary, we speak as those approved by God to be entrusted with the gospel. We are not trying to please people but God, who tests our hearts. 5 You know we never used flattery, nor did we put on a mask to cover up greed— God is our witness. <sup>6</sup> We were not looking for praise from people, not from you or anyone else, even though as apostles of Christ we could have asserted our authority. 7 Instead, we were like young children among you. Just as a nursing mother cares for her children, 8 so we cared for you. Because we

loved you so much, we were delighted to share with you not only the gospel of God but our lives as well. <sup>9</sup> Surely you remember, brothers and sisters, our toil and hardship; we worked night and day in order not to be a burden to anyone while we preached the gospel of God to you. 10 You are witnesses, and so is God, of how holy, righteous and blameless we were among you who believed. 11 For you know that we dealt with each of you as a father deals with his own children, 12 encouraging, comforting and urging you to live lives worthy of God, who calls you into his kingdom and glory. 13 And we also thank God continually because, when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as a human word, but as it actually is, the word of God, which is indeed at work in you who believe. 1 THESSALONIANS 2:1-13 (NIV)
