### So what is a "Gospel Conversation"?

First of all, by 10,000 we do not mean 10,000 people, but *conversations*.

A Gospel Conversation is sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ with someone in need of knowing of his love and grace.

A conversation that points to Jesus as the hero and gives testimony to his grace, as well as our own need for it, counts as a Gospel Conversation.

# Here's three (of many!) types of Gospel Conversations:

- I share with someone what Jesus is doing in my life today. Maybe something good, maybe bringing me through a hard time, maybe a point from Sunday's message that hit me, etc.
- 2. I share with someone my story of putting my faith in Christ.
- 3. I share the truth of the Gospel, and encourage them to believe it themself.

Remember the key is to love. We're loved by Jesus, and so we're sent by Jesus to love others and invite them to follow him with us.

We'll share more soon, including some ideas to help you spark Gospel Conversations with the people God has sent *you* to!

# **Digging Deeper**

#### Use this guide for further personal and group study this week.

- Take some time to revisit the outline of this week's message and talk through it as a group. Have you received God's specific (saving) grace? Have you ever thought of salvation as being a trade that Jesus offers you? Is there a deadline to his offer?
- Go Read Isaiah 53:1-11. Have someone in your group read it out loud, slowly. Then look at it together as you answer the following questions:
  - How do we know that this is Jesus that is being spoken of?
  - What are some truths about Jesus (his mission, his love, his commitment to us, etc.) that we learn from this chapter?
  - If you're one to write in your Bible, underline or highlight the passages/ statements that deeply affect you emotionally.
  - If this was the only information/revelation we had about Jesus, what might our view of him be?
- 3. On the next page, **read Hebrews 4:14-16.** Take time to mark it up. As you do, consider it's connection to Isaiah 53. Why (in part) did Isaiah 53 happen?

- Put an X next to anything that confuses you.

As you close, take time to pray for each other. Consider **dividing into separate groups of men and women** as you pray for one another.





