# TWO PRIMARY VIEWS OF GENDER ROLES:

## **Egalitarianism**

The egalitarian view of gender roles holds that God created men and women equal and that the in the teachings of Jesus and Paul (among others) in the New Testament abolished distinctive gender roles for men and women in the home and the church. To simplify, this position would hold that a husband or a wife can be the head of their home, and a man or a woman can be a pastor/elder.

## Complementarianism

The complementarian view of gender roles holds that God created men and women equal in personhood, but distinctive in their roles in the home and the church. By God's design they complement one another. The husband is to lovingly and humbly, like Jesus, be the leader of his family, the head, and that only a qualified man should be a pastor/elder in the church. Every other role of ministry, however, is open to both men and women according to Scripture. Wawasee Bible holds to a complementarian view.
