## Read Mark 1:40-2:12

1. What stands out to you from this passage? Do you identify more with the leper who sought Jesus out, or the paralytic who was brought to Jesus by his friends?
2. After healing the leper, why does Jesus warn him to not tell anyone?
3. When some determined men brought their paralyzed friend to Jesus, he surprised everyone present by first pronouncing the man's sins forgiven. Why did his action stir up this response?
4. What does this tell you about the state of their hearts?
5. If you were one of the four friends and saw the crowd where Jesus was, what would you do?
6. If you were the paralytic, and you overheard your friends' plan to climb on the roof and lower you in on a mat, what would you do?
7. Do you have friends like that? Why or why not? How could you open yourself up to that type of support and friendship? Are you that type of friend to anyone else?
8. Why didn't Jesus just heal the man like everyone expected? What was he revealing by proclaiming his sins were forgiven first?
9. How do you need Jesus' touch and forgiveness in your life?
10. In what ways is our sin like the leper's disease and the other man's paralysis? What freedom does Jesus' touch give to them? What freedoms does Jesus' forgiveness give to us?

# 6:7 family questions

## Read Mark 2:1-12

A “paralytic” is someone who is unable to move some part (or all) of their body. The man in this passage had to be carried by his four friends just to get around.

- Where were the man’s friends taking him?
- What did they do when they couldn’t get into the house? What would *you* have done?
- Why did they go through all the trouble to get him into the house?
- What two things did Jesus do for the man? (vs. 5, 11-12)

*Identify one or two friends/family members who may not know Jesus. Discuss their need for him and ways you could “bring them” to Jesus. Pray that God would help you do those things.*

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*These simple questions are designed to help you live out the command in Deuteronomy 6:7 to teach our kids and make God’s Word a natural topic of conversation in our homes. Use them at the dinner table, in the car, or whenever you find your family together with a few moments to spare.*
