# **Study Guide**

Questions & Scripture for Further Study

What is this? — Each week people from Wawasee Bible meet in small groups in various homes to learn about Jesus, pray, eat, laugh, and live life together. We call them Life Groups. The questions here are based on the sermon each week (often a parallel passage of Scripture), and guide each group's study. If you're interested in connecting with a Life Group, let us know on a Connect Card at the Connect Desk.

**Use this guide for further personal and group study this week.** For the most impact in your life and in your group, *work through it on your own before you gather with your Life Group*. If your Life Group isn't gathering this week, use this as a guide for further study and growth personally.

#### **Getting Started**

Part of our time together is learning more about one another and sharing life. Toward that end...

When was the last time you made something by following a set of plans? What are the best plans to follow? Any stories of following the plans and it not working?

#### Review...

We're in a series called Bookends, looking at the beginning and the end of Scripture, and how they parallel one another. **Review your message notes.** What stood out to you from the message this week? Do you have questions? Disagreements? Discuss it as a group.

#### **Digging Deeper**

To build a house we need a design and a blueprint from an architect. We want the design to be both beautiful and comfortable, a house that fulfills our dreams.

This week's study will explore some of God's designs and plans for gender, relationship, and marriage in Genesis.

- 1. How would you design the foundation for a satisfying marriage? What about just a satisfying friendship in general? What essential materials would you use?
- 2. God created man and woman in his image (**Genesis 1:26-27**). What various male and female characteristics help you understand what "the image of God" is?
- 3. God declares all he has created is very good (Genesis 1:31). This includes being male or female. How can God's "very good" help you accept and respect the uniqueness of your gender?

- 4. What responsibilities and resources did God give to the man and woman (**Genesis 1:26–30; 2:8–9, 15–17**)?
- 5. Read Genesis 2:18–25. For the first time God declares something in his creation "not good" (2:18). Put yourself in the man's place. How would the parade of animals intensify your loneliness?
- 6. What was the man's part and God's part in meeting Adam's need?
- 7. What tone of voice do you think the man used in his reaction to the woman (2:23)?
- 8. What marriage principles do you draw from 2:24?
- 9. God created marriage primarily to meet our need for companionship. But sometimes a child or a parent can thwart that purpose. How can you guard your companionship in the midst of the pressure of family responsibilities?
- 10. Why was there no shame or self-consciousness between the man and woman (2:25)?
- 11. Why do you think that fact is noted here?
- 12. How has this passage helped you see that God provides for our emotional, physical and spiritual needs in his marriage design?
- 13. What surprises you, comforts you or disturbs you about God's design?

#### Closing

Reflect on God's design for exclusive, permanent, oneness and companionship in marriage. Consider the steps you can take now to prepare for or to enjoy his design.

Pray for everyone in your group by name.
