## Part 4 | Prodigal Dad

Some are like the **YOUNGER SON** (v. 11-24)

he wants the father's things but not the father

and others are like the **OLDER SON** (v. 25-32)

he also wants the father's things but not the father

— both need to **REPENT**. (v. 1-3)

### WHAT IS REPENTANCE?

- 1. Recognize I'm going the wrong way.
  - Sin. Rebellion. Foolishness. Stubbornness. Hardness of Heart...
- 2. Change my mind.

The word "repent" literally means "a change of mind"

3. Turn around and go the other way.

True repentance yields action.
