Acts is NOT about SUPER-CHRISTIANS,

As we begin our study through the Book of Acts, here's a few background facts that may be helpful to know:

Purpose: Acts is intended to be a historical account of the birth and growth of Jesus's Church. Acts is actually the second book of a two-volume account written by Luke, the Gospel of Luke being part one. Each are nearly identical in length and follow similar patterns and conventions of ancient historiography.

Date Written: Between A.D. 63 and 65.

Setting: Acts is the connecting link between Jesus's life and the life of the Church. Where as Luke's Gospel covers an approximately 30-year period between 4 B.C. and A.D. 30, Acts covers the next 30 years up to about A.D. 60 or 62. We also find in Acts the setting for most of the New Testament Letters.

Key Verse: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." – Acts 1:8

 - c. **Put an X** next to anything that confuses you.



Study Guide (continued)

- Three keys to help you make wise choices in your decision making process are: applying Scripture, seeking wise counsel, and connecting with God through prayer. Have any of these things impacted your ability to make a wise decision? What has been vour experience?
- What are some things that could help you pray through and seek God's guidance in your decision making (i.e. time in prayer, consistency, memorize Scripture, pray with others, read Scripture, journal)?
- Which one of the examples above do you want to try or continue to do? Is there a topic or area of your life you want to be more engaged with God (i.e. work, marriage, parenting, finances)?
- 2. Sometimes we make poor decisions, but thankfully God exclusively uses messed up people. Unfortunately, our culture today is fascinated with the mistakes of other people. From social media to reality TV, we are literally immersed in the personal lives of others. With so much focus on other people's "stuff," there is less emphasis on our own issues. What consequences in the following verses could help us remember we all make mistakes and need to be slow to judge others?
