3 MAJOR FEASTS

Acts 2 takes place during the feast of **Pentecost.** God ordained 7 feasts/festivals for Israel in **Leviticus 23**. Pentecost is one of three major feasts that required "native born" Israelite males to pilgrimage to Jerusalem and worship at the Temple each year. Below is an overview of those three major feasts...

Passover (Unleavened Bread)

Celebrated in the spring (modern day March/ April), Passover remembered the Exodus and God's rescue of his people from Egypt. It pointed ahead to Jesus's atoning work on the cross rescuing us as God's wrath for sin "passes over" us and lands on Jesus.

Feast of Weeks (Pentecost)

Pentecost (which means "fiftieth") was celebrated 50 days after Passover. It was celebrated "the day after the seventh Sabbath" after Passover. Since the date was determined by the passing of a "week" of weeks (7 weeks), it was often called the Feast of Weeks. It was celebrated at the wheat harvest and included a first fruits offering to God, remembering that God is the provider of all things. It was about 50 days after the first Passover that God provided the Law at Mount Sinai so Israel would know how to live in the Promised Land. Acts 2 reminds us God is the provider of the Holy Spirit, enabling us to *actually* live the Christian life, empowering us to carry out Jesus's mission.

Feast of Tabernacles (Booths)

About 4 months after Pentecost, the Feast of Tabernacles (or Booths/Tents) was celebrated in late September/early October. The Israelites would make temporary "booths" (like a tent) to dwell in during this week-long feast to remind them of God's covenant promise to dwell among his people and that our time here is temporary. It remembered the ancient Israelites' journey to the Promised Land, and their temporary dwelling places along the way. Many scholars believe that Jesus was born during this time (not December 25 as made popular by the Catholic Church in the 4th Century). John 1:14 says "the Word became flesh and dwelt (lit. 'tabernacled') among us..." Jesus came to live among us temporarily at his first coming, and will forever at his second coming!

- 1. God has given all his followers unique gifts and abilities that He wants us to use in order to serve him and others. What are one or two gifts or abilities you think you have?
- Read the following passages about spiritual gifts. Jot down any guidelines and insights you see in regard to using your gifts and abilities to benefit the church.
 - ⁴ Each of us has one body with many parts. And the parts do not all have the same purpose. ⁵So also we are many persons. But in Christ we are one body. And each part of the body belongs to all the other parts. ⁶ We all have gifts. They differ in keeping with the grace that God has given each of us. Do you have the gift of prophecy? Then use it in keeping with the faith you have. 7 Is it your gift to serve? Then serve. Is it teaching? Then teach. 8 Is it telling others how they should live? Then tell them. Is it giving to those who are in need? Then give freely. Is it being a leader? Then work hard at it. Is it showing mercy? Then do it cheerfully. **ROMANS 12:4-8** (NIrV)

⁷The end of all things is near. So keep a clear mind. Control yourselves. Then you can pray. 8 Most of all, love one another deeply. Love erases many sins by forgiving them. ⁹ Welcome others into your homes without complaining. ¹⁰ God's gifts of grace come in many forms. Each of you has received a gift in order to serve others. You should use it faithfully. 11 If you speak, you should do it like one speaking God's very words. If you serve, you should do it with the strength God provides. Then in all things God will be praised through Jesus Christ. Give him the glory and the power for ever and ever. Amen. 1 PETER 4:7-11 (NIrV)

"I have given ability to all of the skilled workers. They can make everything I have commanded you to make. Here is the complete list. **EXODUS 31:1-6** (NIrV)

- The use of our God-given gifts and abilities are not limited to the church. Can you think of any ways you could use them in places other than our church (like your workplace, school, or home) to serve others?
- What stands out to you the most from these three passages?
- 3. The gifts and abilities God has given us come with the expectation that we will use them to play a role in God's kingdom. Paul uses the analogy of the human body in **1 Corinthians 12:4-26** to describe what it looks like when we all play our part. As you read this passage, what are some of the things that catch your attention in regard to the various roles we play?
 - When it comes to spiritual gifts, it's easy to fall into gift projection or gift envy. Gift projection is where we project a gift or ability we have on others and expect them to be able to do what we do. Gift envy is where we desire a certain gift or ability so much that we attempt to get it, or we idolize those who have it. Have you ever struggled with either of these?
 - Have you ever felt like some gifts are more important than others? If so, which ones?
 - All Christians have been given gifts and abilities to serve on God's team, yet not all Christians are playing their part. What hindrances can you think of that keep people from using their gifts and abilities to play their part?

- 1. In addition to the one or two gifts/abilities you jotted down in Digging Deeper #1, are there any other gifts and strengths you believe God has given you? (Possible areas you might want to consider: your passions and interests, abilities, personality and experiences.)
 - How are you currently investing your gifts/abilities in building God's kingdom
 - Is there anything specific you sense God calling you to start doing now as a result of this weekend's teaching and study?
