

A Few Things the Church *is not*...

In Acts 2:42-47 Luke gives a description of the Church in its earliest days. Over time, though, people have come to associate the Church with things it simply is not and never has been. Here's a few common misconceptions about the Church...

1. The Church is not a building.

We often call our building a church, but the Church is not a building or a place.

2. The Church is not a single denomination.

One metaphor used to describe the Church in Scripture is "family". So we might think of other bible-believing denominations as our extended family.

3. The Church is not a business.

While some principles of business apply to a local church in our context (like financial management, property upkeep, civic responsibility to government filings, hiring and managing staff, etc.), the Church is not a business.

4. The Church is not a country club.

There are certainly social aspects to the Church, but it is not merely a social club for select people. It's for *all* people.

5. The Church is not from one political party.

Sadly our culture has made politics into its religion, and many Christians have wrongly wed their faith to a political point of view. But while every party likes to claim Jesus, none seem to actually want to follow him.

6. The Church is not here for your agenda.

We're about Jesus's agenda, not any individual's or group's.

7. The Church is not your ticket to heaven.

Some have wrongly equated going to church services or being a member of a certain church with salvation. But going to church no more makes you a Christian than going to Taco Bell makes you a chalupa.

¹⁶ From him the whole body, fitted and knit together by every supporting ligament, promotes the growth of the body for building itself up in love by the proper working of each individual part. EPHESIANS 4:11-16 (CSB)

- What's the metaphor Paul is using here to describe the Church? Why do you think he chooses this one?
- What is one of God's purposes for the local church based on this passage?
- 3. Pastor Josh mentioned this week that Acts 2:42-47 is a "descriptive" passage. meaning it simply describes what happened in the earliest days of the church. When reading a narrative/historical account in the Bible like Acts 2, we must first determine if the passage is **descriptive** or **prescriptive** in its account before we can apply it to our own lives. "Descriptive" means the passage simply describes what happened. (When a passage is descriptive, we look for general principles we can pull out and apply to our own lives.) "Prescriptive" means the passage actually prescribes what everyone should do. (When a passage is prescriptive we should do exactly what the people in the Biblical text do.)
 - Why is this important to understand when comparing the similarities and differences between this early church and Wawasee Bible (or any other local church)?
 - Go back and read Acts 2:36-47. What are some principles from Acts 2:42-47 we should apply to our own context?

As you close, take time to pray for each other. Divide into separate groups of men and women and pray for one another.


