Part 13 | Joyful in Trouble

Politics & Religion

In the centuries leading up to Jesus's birth, the influence of Greece permeated the cultures of the Ancient Near East (thanks to the conquests of Alexander the Great), including Israel. This cultural influence of ancient Greece is referred to as Hellenism.

In Israel, there were varied responses to the arrival of Hellenism and its influence on Israel's political and social map. This resulted in factions of religious and political groups that appear throughout the New Testament. *Here's four of the most prominent:*

1. The **Sadducees**

The Sadducees basically accept that Hellenism is present and welcome some of the aspects Graeco-Roman culture. They emerge as the people who are trying to make the best of a bad situation by **simply assimilating to it**. They were a small but wealthy and influential group who believed the Pentateuch alone (first five books of the Old Testament) was God's Word. Because they could find no evidence of resurrection in those writings, they famously refused to believe in resurrection of the dead.

2. The Pharisees

The Pharisees emerged during the period of Antiochus Epiphanes by **engaging culture**. They accept some things, but also push back to limit the amount of influence coming from Hellenistic Culture. Over time this resulted in a ton of rules that—while well-intentioned—were over-and-above what God actually prescribed in his Word. Obeying their rules eventually became more important to them than loving God and others.

3. The Essenes/Qumran Community

This group felt so pressured and overwhelmed by the influx of the culture that **they withdrew from it.** Some even headed out into the dessert (Qumran) where they established their own community and isolated themselves in a world where the influence of a pagan culture was seemingly minimized.

4. The **Zealots**

This crew **fought against the culture** and wanted to eliminate the presence of Gentiles in the Jewish world. You might say they wanted to "Make Israel Great Again", so to speak. Their passionate nationalism eventually lead to a war with Rome and the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem around 70 AD.

Jesus the Reconciler

Amazingly, Jesus **reconciled**—**even appointed as disciples people from all of these groups!** He called them (and us) into a Kingdom that supersedes culture, politics, and religion. Following and obeying Jesus brings true peace, but always invites opposition from those who love their worldview and way of life more than his grace. youareloved.church

what is honorable in the sight of all. ¹⁸ If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. ¹⁹ Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." 20 To the contrary, "if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals on his head." ²¹ Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good. **ROMANS 12:10-21** (ESV)


