Missionaries [™]∧CTS

Philip (8:4-40) One of the first to preach the gospel outside Jerusalem.

Peter & John (8:14-25) Visited new Samaritan believers to encourage them.

Paul (journey to Damascus) (9:1-25) Set out to capture Christians but was captured by Christ.

Peter (9:32-10:48) Led by God to one of the first Gentile families to become Christians—Cornelius's family.

Barnabas (11:25-30) Went to Antioch as an encourager; traveled on to Troas to bring Paul back to Jerusalem from Antioch.

Barnabas, Paul, John Mark (13:1-14:28) Left Antioch for Cyprus, Pamphylia, and Galatia on the first missionary journey.

Barnabas & John Mark (15:36-41) After a disagreement with Paul, they left Antioch for Cyprus.

Paul, Silas, Timothy, Luke (15:36-18:22) Left Antioch to revisit churches in Galatia, then traveled on to Asia, Macedonia, and Achaia on a second missionary journey.

Apollos (18:24-28) Left Alexandria for Ephesus; learned the complete gospel story from Priscilla and Aquila; preached in Athens and Corinth.

Paul, Timothy, Erastus (18:23; 19:1-21:14) Third major missionary journey revisiting churches in Galatia, Asia, Macedonia, and Achaia.

Study Guide Questions & Scripture for Further Study

What is this? – Each week people from Wawasee Bible meet in small groups in various homes to learn about Jesus, pray, eat, laugh, & live life together. We call them Life Groups. The questions here are based on the sermon each week (often a related part of Scripture), and guide each group's study. Getting Started

This is the week of Super Bowl LVII. What sports or activities did you participate in growing up? Which was your favorite? — Do you have a moment of glory (or infamy!) from that sport/activity you can share with your group?

Digging Deeper

Use this guide for further personal and group study this week. For the most impact in your life and in your group, *work through it on your own before you gather with your Life Group.* If your Life Group isn't gathering this week, use this guide for further study personally.

- 1. In **Acts 1:8** the disciples were commanded by Jesus to wait on the Holy Spirit before they acted. Sometimes we may be tempted to jump the gun by acting or speaking instead of waiting and listening for the Holy Spirit. Can you think of a situation when you waited for the Holy Spirit and then acted? How did that turn out?
- 2. Philip is a great example to us in that in the midst of his life being turned upside down, becoming a refugee in Samaria, he continued to live out his faith and share it. **James 1:22** commands us to "not merely listen to the word," but to "do what it says." Work through **James 1:19-27** below and answer the questions that follow.

word planted in you, which can save you. ²² Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive

yourselves. Do what it says. ²³ Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror ²⁴ and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately

forgets what he looks like. ²⁵ But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and

continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what

they do. ²⁶ Those who consider themselves religious and yet do not keep a tight rein on their tongues

deceive themselves, and their religion is worthless. ²⁷ Religion that God our Father accepts as pure

and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being

polluted by the world. JAMES 1:19-27 (NIV)

- What importance do our actions have on our Christian faith?
- As you reflect on this weekend's message and this passage, is there an area in your life where you feel you may be driving yourself?
- 3. Think some more about Philip with your group. Go back through your message notes and the passage (**Acts 8:1-25**) and list everything you notice about Philip.
 - Do you see any similarities between Philip's situation and any you find yourself in right now?
 - What warning does the example of Simon the Magician speak to you?
- 4. Philip "stood in the gap" so to speak, bringing the gospel to people others may not have ventured to. Can you think of any places you need to "stand in the gap" and be a bridge to bring the gospel to others?
- 5. One way to stand in the gap is by praying persistently. Jesus stood in the ultimate gap for us by giving himself up to death on a cross for our sins. Read his final prayer before his crucifixion in **John 17:20-26**.
 - What can we learn about how to pray for others based on how Jesus prayed for us?
 - Is there an area of your life where you feel compelled to pray more persistently?

Divide into separate groups of men and women for this time and pray for one another.


