Part 18 | Saul's Conversion

Acts 9:1-19 (cf. Acts 22:3-21 and 26:2-23)

God can change **ANYONE** (v. 1-2)

no one's too bad Acts 8:3 v. 9:15; 1 Corinthians 6:9-11; 15:9-10

no one's too broken Ephesians 2:1-5ff; Titus 3:5; Isaiah 61:1; Psalm 147:3

at **ANYTIME** (v. 3-9)

up to the last second

God chooses who and when Ephesians 1:4-6, 11; John 6:44

by the power of **THE GOSPEL!** (v. 10-19)

saves sinners Ephesians 2:4-9; Romans 6:23

God uses **NOBODIES** to tell **EVERYBODY** about

God likes to use "nobodies" to tell everybody about Somebody (Jesus). Sometimes we might be tempted to think that God only does big things or meaningful ministry through those we see as "big" or "important" or "more worthy" people.

Even as we read about Saul's conversion in Acts 9 we might be tempted to believe this...

Given Saul's selection as such a key person in the vast program of God, we might think that Peter or one of the other apostles should have been chosen to minister to this important new convert. Not so. God called an unknown disciple named Ananias for this task. In fact, other than when Saul (Paul) references Ananias later, we know nothing else about him and never hear from him again!

This has been true throughout church history. Consider this list of "nobodies":

John Staupitz. He's the man who helped lead Martin Luther to faith in Jesus Christ.

John Egglen. John was instrumental in the conversion of C. H. Spurgeon, one of the greatest preachers in history.

Edward Kimball. He was just a shoe salesman . . . who happened to be D. L. Moody's spiritual mentor.

Mordecai Ham: A little-known evangelist who preached the night that Billy Graham gave his life to Christ.

We never know how God might use us to touch a life that will, in turn, touch millions. Yield yourself to the purposes of God, and be faithful when he calls.

Be a "nobody" that God can use to tell everybody about Somebody!

Digging Deeper

Use this guide for further personal and group study this week. For the most impact in your life and in your group, work through it on your own before you gather with your Life Group. If your Life Group isn't gathering this week, use this guide for further study personally.

- 1. Consider this truth: we don't get to pick our brothers and sisters (physical or spiritual!). The prophet Jonah is an example of someone who wanted to keep his enemies out of the family of God. As you read Jonah's story, what are some possible reasons Jonah was so angry at the Ninevites? What didn't he understand about God that caused his anger? (Before you meet, read through the Old Testament book of Jonah. Don't worry, it's short!)
- What are some hurdles you might face in wanting your "enemies" to know God and receive His love and forgiveness?
- 3. Take some time to read and study **Titus 3:3-7** and **1 Corinthians 1:26-30** below. As you do...

³ At one time we too were foolish, disobedient, deceived and enslaved by all kinds of passions and pleasures. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, 6 whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, ⁷ so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. **TITUS 3:3-7** (NIV)

²⁶ For consider your calling, brothers: not many of you were wise according to worldly standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. 27 But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; ²⁸ God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, ²⁹ so that no human being might boast in the presence of God. 30 And because of him you are in Christ Jesus, who became to us wisdom from God, righteousness and sanctification and redemption.

1 CORINTHIANS 1:26-30 (ESV)

- How might the things you see in theses passages help you overcome those hurdles and welcome others into the family of God?
- In Matthew 5:44, Jesus tells His disciples to pray for those who persecute them. If you were to pray for someone who is your "enemy", what would you pray for them? (Write your prayer below).
- 5. One essential when it comes to loving our enemies is having renewed mind. Renewing our minds involves focusing on what God desires and thinking like Christ rather than like the world, culture or our natural way of thinking. **Read** Romans 8:5-6; Ephesians 4:22-24; and Colossians 3:7-11. How do these verses reinforce the idea of being like Christ by renewing our minds?
 - Is there an aspect of God's character you can set your mind on that will help you to better love someone who is difficult for you to love?

- 6. Think of two or three people you view as being in the wrong about something. Is your response to them more like Jonah's response to the Ninevites or Ananias' response to Saul?
 - Is there something you can do this week to respond more like Ananias to these people?
