#### **JOHN 20:1-31**

### Jesus's resurrection is often met with **DOUBT**.

resurrection = Jesus was clearly dead, then rose back to life, never to die again

doubters: Mary Magdalene, the Disciples, Thomas John 20:11-29

## but he graciously **MEETS US** in it

personally

in the Word John 20:30-31

## and left us strong **EVIDENCE**!

#### biblical

- 1. Jesus's resurrection was prophesied in advance. Isaiah 53:8-12
- 2. Jesus predicted his resurrection. Matthew 12:38–40; Mark 8:31; 9:31; 10:33–34; John 2:18–2
- 3. Jesus clearly died. John 19:34-35
- 4. Jesus was buried in a tomb that was easy to find. Isaiah 53:9; Matthew 27:57-60
- 5. Jesus appeared physically—not just spiritually—alive three days after his death. Matthew 28:9: John 20:17: 20:20-29: Luke 24:31, 36: 1 Corinthians 15
- 6. Jesus's resurrection was recorded as Scripture shortly after it occurred. Mark 14:53, 54, 60, 61, 63
- 7. Jesus's resurrection was celebrated in the earliest church creeds. 1 Corinthians 15:3-4
- 8. Jesus's resurrection convinced his *family* to worship him as God. John 7:5; 1 Corinthians 15:7; James 1:1; Acts 12:17; 15:12-21; 21:18; Gal. 2:9; Acts 1:14; Jude 1
- 9. Jesus's resurrection was confirmed by his most bitter enemies. Philippians 3:4-6; Acts 7:54-60; Acts 9

#### circumstantial

- 1. Jesus's disciples were transformed. Compare Peter in Luke 22:54-62 with Peter in Acts 3 & 4
- 2. Jesus's disciples remained loyal to Jesus as their Messiah.
- **3. The day of worship changed.** Acts 20:7; 1 Corinthians 16:1–2; Revelation 1:10
- 4. Women discovered the empty tomb. Mark 15:40, 47; 16:1
- 5. The entirety of early church preaching was centered on the historical fact of Jesus's resurrection.
- 6. Jesus's tomb was not enshrined.
- 7. Christianity exploded on the earth and billions claim to be Christians today.

### **Digging Deeper**

#### Use this guide for further personal and group study this week.

1. In the message this weekend Pastor Josh encouraged and reminded us that there is good news for doubting Christians. Like Mary not finding Jesus in the empty tomb or Thomas uncertain of Jesus actually being alive—we can feel perplexed, uncertain, and even doubtful of what God is up to in our lives. Thankfully, the Bible provides us with clarity and instruction we can turn to for comfort and guidance.

Reflect on Isaiah 46:9-11. Have you ever seen God's purposes or truths from the Bible clearly after a time when his purposes or the Bible seemed confusing? What was it like?

### Word Find: John 20:1-7 (ESV)

Find the words **bolded** below.

1 Now on the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. 2 So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." 3 So **Peter** went out with the **other disciple**, and they were going **toward** 

the tomb. 4 Both of them were running together, but the other **disciple** outran **Peter** and reached the tomb first. 5 And stooping to look in, he saw the **linen cloths lying there**, but he did not go in. 6 Then Simon Peter came. following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen cloths lying there, 7 and the face cloth, which had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen cloths but folded up in a place by itself.

- 2. Have you ever felt like God did not understand what you were going through? What truths in Psalm 139:1-6 can you rely on should that feeling arise in the future?
  - <sup>1</sup> O Lord, you have examined my heart and know everything about me. <sup>2</sup> You know when I sit down or stand up. You know my thoughts even when I'm far away. 3 You see me when I travel and when I rest at home. You know everything I do. <sup>4</sup> You know what I am going to say even before I say it, Lord. <sup>5</sup> You go before me and follow me. You place your hand of blessing on my head. 6 Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too great for me to understand! **PSALM 139:1-6** (NLT)
- Of the three "doubters" Pastor Josh mentioned in the message this weekend, which do you most identify with?
  - Do you have doubts? What do you do with them?
  - Has God ever met you in your doubt like he did with those in John 20? Write about it or tell your group about it.
  - After a number of people decided not to believe and follow Jesus, he asked the disciples if they would leave him, too. Look at Peter's reply in John 6:68. How might his example encourage you when you doubt?

<sup>68</sup> Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life," JOHN 6:68 (ESV)


