Types of "Gospel Conversations"

Any intentional conversation with someone you hope to meet Jesus counts as a Gospel Conversation. As you count your conversations, try to categorize them as to what "level" of a conversation it is.

NOTE, there is **not** a "right" or "wrong" here, it's just a tool to help you gradually move toward level 5 conversations with those far from God, with hopes that they might meet Jesus.

Categories of Gospel Conversations:

- Connecting (News/Weather/Sports)
 - These are casual "connecting" conversations. We all have them every day, multiple times, even with those we're closest to.
- Personal (Personal Details, Family, etc.)

 Personal conversations go further to reveal or disclose something from each other's personal lives. Family, vocation, frustrations, personal joys, interests, etc.
- Their Story

Here you learn something of their *spiritual* background, knowledge, interest, etc.

We are sent to love people and invite them to follow Jesus with us

- My Story
 Sharing part or all of your faith story.
 - Sharing part or all of the Gospel with them, Jesus's work, our response, etc.

Study Guide Questions & Scripture for Further Study

Getting to Know You

Part of our goal at Life Group is just learning more about each other. Toward that end, here's two totally <u>random</u> questions to discuss and break the ice as you get going. Have everyone answer at least one:

- 1. What was your biggest childhood fear? (Clowns? Being lost? Monsters? The dark?) 2. What's your favorite candy?
- **Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching,** was there anything you heard for the first time, that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?

Digging Deeper

Use this guide for further personal and group study this week.

This week we saw Paul make a number of right choices, but that ended in difficult results—including being wrongly accuses, beaten, and arrested. This weeks study will explore more of what the Bible says when our right choices yield hard things.

- 1. One of the ways to respond when the right choice brings a tough result is to not assume every valley means a wrong turn. One bit of truth that can help us understand this principle is to know the difference between a trial and a temptation. James, the brother of Jesus (and the James in our passage this week), gives us some incredible wisdom and insight when it comes to trials. As you read, underline anything that catches your attention, and put a question mark next to anything that might be unclear.
 - ² Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, ³ for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. ⁴ And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing. ⁵ If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him. ⁶ But let him ask in faith, with no doubting, for the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea that is driven and tossed by the wind. ⁷ For that person must not suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord; ⁸ he is a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways. . . . ¹² Blessed is the man who remains steadfast under trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life, which God has promised to those who love him. ¹³ Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am being tempted by God," for God cannot be tempted with evil, and he himself tempts no one. ¹⁴ But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own

JAMES 1:2-8, 12-15 (ESV)

- Although none of us ask for the "tough" result, God often is able to use trials to mature us. Have you ever thought of trials through this lens? How might viewing them this way help us to respond to our next trial?
- In **James 1:13-15**, we read that going through trials can cause a person to face temptation. Think about a trial that you or someone you know has walked through. What were some of the temptations faced during the trial? (i.e. question God with "why," distrust of God's goodness, unhealthy coping with pain, bitterness, anger, hatred)
- Why do you think so many temptations seem to pop up when we are experiencing a trial?
- What advice/encouragement/truth would you share with someone walking through a trial to avoid falling prey to temptation?
- 2. In the life of Jesus, there was a family Jesus loved dearly— Mary, Martha and Lazarus. Even though they did the "right" things, Lazarus still died. Read John 11:32-44 and make note of anything that stands out.
 - In the passage above Jesus had a visible response to the situation. What might we be able to learn from Jesus' response that we can apply when we have an opportunity to respond to others?
 - Can you think of a time when someone's tough season had a positive influence on your relationship with Jesus?
 - In the passage above, Jesus waited four days after Lazarus' death to raise him from the dead. Take a moment to ponder what Mary and Martha must have felt in those four days. Have you ever felt like God wasn't working on your timetable?

As you close, take time to pray for each other. Consider **dividing into separate** groups of men and women as you pray for one another.
