Some of the Obstacles Faced in Acts

Paul:

- Acts 9:23-25: Jews conspire to kill Paul in Damascus.
- Acts 13:6-8: Opposition from Elymas the sorcerer in Cyprus.
- **Acts 13:44-50:** Jealousy and contradiction from Jews in Pisidian Antioch.
- Acts 14:2, 5-6: Stirring up of Gentiles and poisoning minds against Paul in Iconium, leading to a plot to stone him.
- Acts 14:19-20: Paul is stoned and left for dead in Lystra.
- **Acts 16:6-7:** The Holy Spirit prevents Paul and his companions from preaching in Asia and Bithynia.
- Acts 16:16-24: Paul and Silas are beaten and imprisoned in Philippi.
- **Acts 17:5-9:** Jealous Jews form a mob and attack Jason's house in Thessalonica.
- **Acts 17:13:** Jews from Thessalonica come to Berea to stir up crowds against Paul.
- Acts 18:12-17: Paul is brought before Gallio by the Jews in Corinth.
- **Acts 19:23-41:** Riot led by Demetrius in Ephesus due to economic threat from Paul's preaching.
- Acts 20:3: Jews plot to kill Paul as he plans to sail to Syria.
- **Acts 21:10-14:** Agabus the prophet foretells Paul's arrest in Jerusalem, leading to his companions urging him not to go.
- Acts 21:27-36: Paul is seized by Jews in Jerusalem and almost killed.
- Acts 22:22-23: Paul faces an uproar in Jerusalem, leading to him being taken into Roman custody.
- **Acts 23:12-22:** Jews form a conspiracy to kill Paul, taking an oath not to eat or drink until they do.
- **Acts 23:23-24:** Paul is transferred to Caesarea under heavy guard due to the threat on his life.
- **Acts 24:1-9:** Accusations from Ananias and Tertullus before Felix in Caesarea.

- **Acts 24:22-27:** Paul is kept in custody by Felix, who frequently converses with him but leaves him imprisoned for two years hoping for a bribe.
- **Acts 25:2-3:** Jewish leaders plan to ambush and kill Paul during his transfer to Jerusalem.
- **Acts 27:13-20:** Paul faces a severe storm at sea while being transported to Rome.
- **Acts 27:42-44:** Paul faces the threat of execution by the soldiers during the shipwreck.
- Acts 28:3-5: Paul is bitten by a viper on the island of Malta.

Peter and John:

- **Acts 4:1-3:** Peter and John are arrested by the Sadducees while speaking to the people.
- **Acts 4:18-21:** Peter and John are warned by the Sanhedrin not to speak or teach in the name of Jesus.
- **Acts 5:17-18:** Peter and the apostles are arrested and put in the public jail by the high priest and Sadducees.
- **Acts 5:40-42:** The apostles are flogged and ordered not to speak in the name of Jesus before being released.

Stephen:

- **Acts 6:8-15:** Opposition from the Freedmen, leading to false accusations and his arrest.
- **Acts 7:54-60:** Stephen is stoned to death by an enraged mob after his speech to the Sanhedrin.

Philip:

Acts 8:1-4: General persecution against the church in Jerusalem, leading to the scattering of the believers, including Philip.

Paul and Barnabas:

- **Acts 15:1-2:** Dispute with certain men from Judea regarding the necessity of circumcision for salvation.
- **Acts 15:36-39:** Sharp disagreement between Paul and Barnabas over John Mark, leading to their separation.

General Persecution:

- **Acts 8:1-3:** Saul (later Paul) leads a severe persecution against the church in Jerusalem, imprisoning many believers.
- **Acts 12:1-4:** King Herod arrests and executes James, the brother of John, and arrests Peter intending to do the same.
