

Study Guide **Questions & Scripture for Further Study**

What is this? - Each week people from Wawasee Bible meet in small groups in various homes to learn about Jesus, pray, eat, laugh, & ive life together. We call them Life Groups. The questions here are based on the sermon each week (often a related part of Scripture), and guide each group's study. Part of our goal at Life Group is just learning more about each other. Toward that end, here's a <u>random</u> question to discuss and break the ice as you get going. Have everyone answer:

If you were an action figure, what two accessories would come in your box?

Digging Deeper - A Bible Study

Use this guide for further personal and group study this week. For the most impact in your life and in your group, work through it on your own before you gather with your Life Group. If your Life Group isn't gathering this week, use this guide for further study personally.

- 1. We've all probably questioned God at some point. This is exactly what Abraham did in Gen 18. After hearing that God was planning to destroy Sodom and Gomorrah, he questioned God and tried to negotiate pardon for Sodom. Throughout his bargaining, Abraham wasn't disrespectful. Rather, his questions showed his concern for upholding God's reputation for righteousness and justice. In all his negotiating, Abraham's chief concern was to know, "Will not the Judge of all the earth do right?" (Gen. 18:25 NIV). Read Genesis 18:16-33.
- Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything you heard for the first time, that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you? Discuss it with your group before moving on.
- 3. Previous chapters in Genesis established the utter wickedness of Sodom, setting the state for its destruction in Genesis 18. Read Genesis 13:1-13 and 14:8–16, 21–24. Discuss the following questions:
 - How did Lot's decision in Gen. 13 affect his life?
 - How did Abraham demonstrate his lovalty to Lot?
- 4. God's "righteousess" refers to his "rightness" in all things. His "justice" is his action that accord with his "rightness" to always do what is right. — Read **Psalm 9** (especially **9:7-8**). Discuss the following questions:
 - How does the psalmist describe God's rule?
 - How is God's righteousness and justice seen in the psalmists' praise?
 - God chose Abraham "to do righteousness and justice" and to teach his descendants to keep the way of the Lord. In what ways does your life reflect God's righteousness and justice?

Study Guide (continued)

- How can you better demonstrate God's righteousness and justice to others?
- 5. Abraham's first question was concerned with God's justice, asking if he would destroy the righteous with the wicked (Gen 18:23). He bargained with God, lowering the number of righteous needed to spare the city, showing faith in God's mercy. Despite Sodom's destruction due to a lack of 10 righteous people, God's mercy actually exceeded Abraham's intercession.

Discuss his negotiation with God:

- How does Abraham display an understanding of God's righteousness & justice?
- What does the destruction of Sodom show about God's justice?
- What does it show about God's mercy?

Taking It Home

Pastor Josh noted that when Abraham negotiated with God, he did not do so based on what he could bring. He did not say, "God, if you spare Sodom, I'll offer extra sacrifices." Instead, Abraham negotiated based on who God is. He appealed to aspects of God's character: His justice and righteousness. By doing so, Abraham showed that he understood what is important to God. God is not afraid of our questions; He wants to talk with us and hear our struggles. But when we approach God, we should "seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness" (Matt. 6:33 ESV).

Discuss the following as you wrap up:

- How can a fuller understanding of the character of God enhance your prayer life? Does thinking about who God is change the way you pray? In what ways?
- Do you know anyone—in your church or in your family—who demonstrates these facets of God's character? Have you ever known them to guestion God? What could you learn from their experience?

Prayer

As you close, take time to pray for each other. **Divide into separate groups of men and women.** Feel free to share requests, just be sure each person gets prayed for.
