### Study Guide **Questions & Scripture for Further Study**

What is this? - Each week people from Wawasee Bible meet in small groups in various homes to learn about Jesus, pray, eat, laugh, & ive life together. We call them Life Groups. The questions here are based on the sermon each week (often a related part of Scripture), and guide each group's study. #### **Getting to Know You**

Part of our goal at Life Group is just learning more about each other. Toward that end, here's a <u>random</u> question to discuss and break the ice as you get going. Have everyone answer:

What's one book, movie, or song that you think everyone should experience at least once?

### **Digging Deeper – A Bible Study**

Use this guide for further personal and group study this week. For the most impact in your life and in your group, work through it on your own before you gather with your Life Group. If your Life Group isn't gathering this week, use this guide for further study personally.

- 1. Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything you heard for the first time, that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you? Discuss it with your group before moving on.
- 2. We have all experienced tests of our faith—situations that require us to trust that God will provide. In these times, the question becomes: How do we respond? Do we allow fear and doubt to control us, or do we trust God with an extreme faith? Abraham, too, encountered many faith tests. Sometimes he obeyed and trusted God's promises; other times, he acted out of fear or took control himself. In Genesis 22, God presented him with one final, extreme test of faith (Gen 22:1). Read Genesis 21:1-8.
- 3. The various mentions of Abraham's age in 21:1-8 anchor the progression of events in real time and show the accuracy of God's promise in 18:14. The mentions of his age also indicate how long he had to wait for God to fulfill his promise!
  - What are some of Abraham's responses whilst he's waiting on God?
  - How does God use this period of waiting in Abraham's life?
  - How does God use it to show his power?
- 4. If this were merely a story about God fulfilling his promise, it could end here with Abraham and Sarah finally having the son and heir they had always hoped for. But the story of Abraham is also about his faith. Abraham's resolve had been tested repeatedly, and now it would be tested again especially when it came to his relationships with his two sons. In 21:8-24 we see the struggle re-emerge between Sarah and Hagar. Read 21:8-24.

### WORD FIND IN THE WORD

Find the words from a passage related to this week's message.

#### Word Find: Genesis 22:15-18 (NLT)

Find the words **bolded** below.

15 Then the angel of the LORD called again to Abraham from heaven.

<sup>16</sup> "This is what the **LORD says**: Because you have obeyed me and have not withheld even your son, your **only** son, I swear by my own name that 17 I will **certainly bless** you. I will multiply your descendants **bevond number**. **like** the stars in the sky and the sand on the **seashore**. Your descendants will conquer the cities of their enemies. 18 And through your descendants all the nations of the earth will be **blessed**—all **because** you have **obeyed** me."

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### Study Guide (continued)

- Sarah's struggle was ultimately a consequence of her and Abraham not trusting God back in Genesis 16. Over a decade later she still seems to be bitter and jealous. How would you have responded to Sarah?
- Have you faced consequences in your life (or God's discipline) that you've been able to turn into a trial and let God shape you? How can someone do that?
- 5. God commanded Abraham to take Isaac to Moriah and sacrifice him—his beloved son—as a burnt offering (Gen 21:2). If Abraham had ever felt at liberty to question God (Gen 18:22–33), surely it would be on this occasion. But instead, Abraham obeyed without question. The narrative methodically describes Abraham's actions: He got up early, saddled the donkey, cut wood for the sacrifice, took Isaac and two servants, and headed for Moriah—all without speaking a word. Go read Genesis 22:1-24.
  - Can you think of a time when God called on you to exhibit extreme faith? How did you do it, and what was the result?
  - Reflect on a time when you felt your faith was tested. What made it difficult or easy for you to believe?

### **Taking It Home**

As Abraham and Isaac continued on, Isaac carried the wood for the sacrifice, indicating that he had grown significantly since his last appearance in the story. Abraham's response provides the key to understanding this entire event: "God will provide the lamb for a burnt offering" (Gen 22:8). The test hinged on the tension between God's past provision and His promise to provide in the future. The success of this test led to God reaffirming His covenant to bless Abraham with countless descendants and to bless the world through his offspring, ending the story as it began—with the promise of worldwide blessing.

As you wrap up, discuss this question:

• Have you ever experienced a time when you were more focused on what God had provided for you in the past than on what He might have planned for you in the future?
